

Private Harry Dallow

1st Battalion, Herefordshire Regiment

Harold was born on the 11th of June 1887 and baptised in Dymock one month later on 11 July 1887. His father, George Henry, was a farm labourer and his mother was Elizabeth and at the time of Harry's birth the family was living at Boyce Court in Dymock. His military records show that he was born in Dymock, although the War Graves Commission details give his birthplace as Tretire, Ross. He had an older brother, Albert who was also baptised in Dymock. It is known that he died on 19 June 1916 whilst serving in UK. He was just 19 years old. He is buried in Yatton Churchyard, between Much Marcle and Ross in Herefordshire. He is not commemorated on any local War Memorial.

From his military records, it is presumed that he served only in the UK and therefore would not have been eligible for any of the usual Great War Campaign medals. However, his family would have been eligible to receive the Commemorative Medal and scroll from HM King George V but it is not known if they did in fact receive this medal and scroll.

His Regimental number was 2267.
