

## *Arthur Robert Hodges*

### *Lance Corporal Herefordshire Regiment*

Arthur Hodges was born about 1890 in Much Marcle. Little is known of his early history but it is known that he was married and living in Dymock with his wife, Fanny in 1914.

He was killed on 2 September 1915 and is commemorated in the Helles War Cemetery in Gallipoli, Turkey. It is presumed that his service would have qualified him for all the medals shown below in addition to a commemorative medal from the King sent to the families of all those who were killed in the war.

He is commemorated on the Dymock War Memorial and also on the Dymock Roll of Honour in St Mary's Church.
