

Ewart Andrew Morris

Private, Royal Army Service Corps



Ewart Morris (Known as Andrew Ewart Morris in some records) was born in 1895 and lived in Bromsberrow, being baptised in Bromsberrow on 20 October of that year. Some records give his home town address as Dymock, possibly since much of the modern parish of Bromsberrow was in Dymock parish at the time of the War. His father, Thomas came from Cleobury Mortimer in Herefordshire and was a Blacksmith. His mother's name was Mary and she was from Redmarley. The family were recorded as living in Bromesberrow in 1911 and their home address was given as Baven Hill House Bromsberrow in the records of Ewart's death. Ewart was the youngest of the family and he had two sisters and two brothers, Jessie, Archibald, Beatrice and Victor.

Ewart died on the western front on 24 February 1915 and is buried in St. Server Cemetery, Near Rouen, France. Ewart's Corps number was M2/033092.

He is commemorated on the Bromsberrow War Memorial.
